



Psychiatrist Medical Director Behavior Health Department

The Juvenile Justice Center of Philadelphia (JJC) is a non-profit, multi-service organization that serves the needs of disadvantaged children, youth and families. Our mission is to maintain families through supportive services, to prevent children and youth from being placed in care, and also to ready families for reunion with their children. JJC has **Psychiatrist** position openings in our Coulter Street office. A **Child/Adolescent Psychiatrist** is needed for this position.

Job Summary

The Psychiatrist is an integral team member of the Behavioral Health (BH) department. The Psychiatrist serves as a consultant to the team and is the assigned attending community Psychiatrist to the designated clients. As a consultant, the Psychiatrist is available to all staff, clients, and families to offer valuable information and training on the course of illness and treatment, treatment options, primary effects and side effects of medication and other medical complications. The Psychiatrist primarily provides Medication Management services, but also can participate in Quarterly Evaluator's meetings, case conference meetings as needed and complete evaluations to assess the clients' current behavioral health needs. ***Position is outpatient office hours only position, i.e. – no on-call, emergency care duties are required.***

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Meet at least once every 3 months to discuss the needs in Behavioral Health as it relates to the Medication Management services and Evaluations for clients within the Behavioral Health Division
- Provide information and education to staff, families, and consumer on the course of illness and treatment, treatment options, primary effects and side effects of medication and other medical complications during yearly trainings for the Behavioral Health Division.
- Consult with staff on an assigned case when a specific client is in crisis and will provide psychiatric and or medical direction/guidance.
- Review Meds Only Plan with clients during medication management only clients' appointments.
- Serve as Psychiatric consultant within the agency's Clinical Team and provide on call emergent care if there is a clinical emergency.
- Complete Initial Psychiatric Evaluations, Comprehensive Bio-psychosocial Evaluations and Comprehensive Bio-psychosocial Re-evaluations as needed, assess for/complete Medication Management monitoring appointments for the clinic.
- Provide supervision to Behavioral Health Staff including therapists, BSCs, Psychologists as it relates to the care and services provided to the clients/families.
- Complete progress notes and other documentation as required and needed
- Participate in all mandatory trainings are required annually by CBH, DPW, and Medical Assistance Bulletins.



Qualifications

- A doctorate in medicine or osteopathy from an accredited school of medicine or osteopathy in the United States of America or a valid doctoral degree from a foreign school of medicine and evidence of successful completion of the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates. Board certified preferred.
- A successfully completed psychiatry residency in an A.C.G.M.E. accredited residency program.
- Minimum of one year experience providing psychiatric care and consultation.
- **Child/Adolescent Psychiatrist** is needed for the Coulter Street location.
- A current and valid Pennsylvania medical license.
- A complete listing of all health care settings wherein privileges have been granted.
- A listing, upon request, of the location, dates and reasons for denial/revocation/termination of clinical privileges that have been granted at any and all health care settings.
- Evidence of a current National Practitioners Data Bank (N.P.D.B.) check.
- Valid and current D.E.A. certification.
- Current, good-standing enrollment in the PA Medical Assistance Program.
- Professional liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$500,000 per occurrence and \$1,500,000 in the aggregate along with evidence of participation in the PA Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (M-CARE) Fund.
- Compliance with all state and discipline-specific standards and regulations.
- Valid Child Abuse (Act 33), Criminal History, and FBI clearances
- Participation in and completion of all CBH mandatory in-services

Position Status

Position available on a contractual basis for a minimum of 16 hours weekly, flexible Monday-Friday 8am-8pm with Saturday hours available.
